

General Communication Skills around Sexual Health and HIV Workshop

What is it about?

Sexually transmitted infections, including HIV continue to have a major impact on health and wellbeing. This training will explore sexual health in its medical, social and psychological aspects, provide up-to-date and accurate information on sexual health and sexually transmitted infections in the UK, and provide participants with the knowledge and communication skills to challenge the barriers which can prevent sexual health and promote the motivators which enable good sexual health.

Who is it for?

This training is appropriate for anyone who might be involved in promoting sexual health in a formal or informal, voluntary or professional context. This might include teachers, youth workers, carers, tutors or mentors, and those working with learning disabilities.

What will participants gain?

- ✓ An understanding of 'sexual health' in its medical, social, and psychological dimensions.
- ✓ Basic knowledge of sexually transmitted infections in the UK
- ✓ Signposting skills around sexual health and HIV
- ✓ Practice in identifying factors which promote good sexual health, and barriers which prevent it.
- ✓ Learn simple techniques to evaluate sexual health interventions
