

Raising Awareness around HIV Workshop

What is it about?

Treatments for HIV have improved enormously over the last two decades but people living with HIV often experience rejection, isolation and stigma. These can seriously impact on their general health and well-being and may affect their ability to benefit from the medical treatments which are available. Because of the stigma around HIV many people living with the virus may choose not to disclose their status. You may think that you and your organisation don't work with anyone living with HIV - but HIV is very much a 'hidden disability', and more and more people are actually living with the virus or affected by it.

Who is it for?

This training is appropriate for anyone who is or might be working to support someone living with HIV as a carer or other professional whether in the public, private or voluntary sectors or as a private individual. Anyone working with people who are living with Hepatitis B or C would also find this training appropriate. The training is relevant to those who have a 'hands-on' support role – but also to trainers and equality/diversity leads.
