

## ‘Digital Links’

‘Digital Links’ is our brand new and exciting digital inclusion programme for parents. The programme consists of three, two hour long sessions that take place once a week, over three weeks. The main aims will be to build confidence in using social media and in supporting children with their social media, as well as raising awareness of the potential associated risks. Sessions will be fun and interactive. The programme will run in a range of venues in four localities: Wisbech; Cambridge; Ely and Huntingdon. The course will be open to all parents but particularly aimed at parents with older children. We expect the programme to attract a high number of parents of children that have been involved in an incident or have been flagged as vulnerable. **We are now recruiting tutors to work with us on a sessional basis.**

### Digital Links Tutor

You will need a Level 3 in teaching and training and be able to work on a sessional basis to run a series of 2 hour (Prep, delivery and review) sessions, over the course of a year in term time. You will also be required to attend occasional meetings and trainings. You will have a good understanding of social media and the Internet, have a friendly and approachable personality, have good written, oral and time management skills, be able to work in a fun and creative way and be able to engage with parents of all abilities. Hourly rate is £15 and relevant travel costs will be covered.

The purpose of the role is to:

- Lead sessions on Internet and social media safety with parents
- Support parents in creating a social media account
- Support young people volunteers
- Run volunteer training sessions
- Complete essential paperwork
- Write session reviews
- Build relationships with local schools and community groups
- Help Promote the workshops
