



## ‘SLIP Programme’

SLIP stands for Sex, the Law, Internet and Porn

SLIP is an alternative and age appropriate relationships and sex education programme. It is suitable for any young person age 9 to 24 who, for whatever reason, did not engage, or is currently finding it difficult to engage, in Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) or Relationships Education (RE) in school.

To be eligible for SLIP this lack of engagement is impacting on their behaviour and attitudes towards relationships and sex. These attitudes and behaviours could be putting themselves or others at risk of harm, or could do so in the future if left unaddressed.

SLIP aims to make the following differences to the lives of young people:

- Give young people a better understanding of the law around sex
- Enable young people to communicate better about sex and relationships
- Equip young people with the confidence and self-esteem to feel better about themselves and to have a better relationship with their body

## **The young person's lack of engagement with RSE in school could be due to, for example:**

- Education and/or behavioural difficulties
- Having a custodial sentence
- Finding it difficult to take part in RSE/RE sessions
- Being shy/embarrassed/finding school in general difficult
- Missing a lot of school because of a disruptive/chaotic family life
- Long periods of absence due to ill health
- Learned behaviours
- Being home schooled

## **The content**

SLIP is open to both groups and to individuals. The programme is made up of 7 modules and each module covers one of the following topics: Introduction, Body Image, Am I normal?, Consent, Abuse and Exploitation, Online Safety and Exploitation, Pornography and Sexting

Ideally, young people attend one module per week but there is some flexibility, and we can add one of two more sessions if the young person would benefit from extra time on any module or from working at a slower pace.

We can deliver the programme in schools, other provisions, community venues or in the young person's home if there is a need and it is appropriate. If it isn't appropriate to work with an individual during school hours we can arrange sessions for after school.

The programme is available free of charge to anyone living within Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. There is a charge outside of Cambridgeshire. Please visit our website for information on charges and to find out more about our other services.
